## Chuckwagon at Cub World, Explained!

Has it been a few years since you've been to a Chuckwagon? Does your Pack plan on going this year? Would you like some more information? Do you enjoy going to Chuckwagon at Cub World and look forward to our improvements every year?

For those who have never been, a Chuckwagon is an event similar to the Boy Scout Klondike. The Cub Scouts pull a wagon to different stations. The wagon can be your rusty old Radio Flyer or your Pack can build a wagon that the pioneers would have loved to take across the plains! They go from station to station, practicing Scout skills and playing games or doing activities. They even get the opportunity to participate in archery and BB. Some stations are competitions and some are just for fun.

As requested, every wagon is guaranteed to participate in both archery and BB. We've accomplished this by adding a second BB range, enlarging the existing archery range and giving you a set time to be at each one. We listen to suggestions and even improved on that. Your assigned range is now in the same area that you are engaging in the other activities. You don't have to hurry across camp to get to your assigned time.

The other noteworthy improvement is with the awards. Stations close at 3pm so station leaders can get the awards to the administration building. Packs then go to the amphitheater to watch a show. They join in performing skits and songs or just sing and laugh while they watch others. The awards are then tallied and brought out as close to 3:30pm as we can. If you were at Chuckwagon 10 years ago, the volunteers tried hard but the awards took forever. Scouts were tired and many left before the awards were even finished. With the advances in technology, the computer does the tallying for us. Awards are read off and you're out of there close to 4pm!

The day will be filled with fun and surprises no matter what the weather is. Chuckwagon happens rain or shine and the Scouts have fun either way. When you register in the morning, you are given a bag with your patches and some goodies that we've prepared for you. During the day, if you stop by our administration building or see some of our key Leaders, sing or shout out your cheer for them and you'll get some cool themed prizes. It is a day filled with fun and we don't want you to miss it!

The only problem you may encounter this year is that you may not get to join us. When a good time is had by all, word spreads. We are also advertising more this year. There is a cap of how many Scouts may attend, so register early. If you wait to register until the last minute, we may have reached our maximum numbers and you'll miss out on the fun!

We hope to see you at the Chuckwagon at Cub World. It is Saturday, May 20, 2017 and this year's theme is "Construction Zone". Your Webelos can continue their fun by staying over for our Webelos Overnighter, directly following the Chuckwagon. They will earn Belt Loops while practicing Scout skills and participating in the many surprises that the Leaders have in store! # Explanation Sheet for Wagons

## Chuckwagon 2017

### “Construction”

Our main objective is to HAVE FUN!

In the morning, report to the Wagon Inspection station (after registering) and have 1 adult remain with the wagon until you are inspected. After inspection, you will be awarded a special item to show, if asked, throughout the day. Wagon inspection is MANDATORY!

Each wagon has a wagon number. Wagon numbers will be: 101-120, 201-220, 301-320 and 401-420. Your number will be given to you at the Nicholson Administration Building when you come in to register your wagon. The rank of the wagon is determined by the rank of the oldest Cub.

Beads are given out at each station for each member of a wagon (paid adults may have one if they wish). To save time, stations may give the correct number to the adult on the wagon. You can get Den Doodles (Leather disc that the beads and plastic lacing/gimp tie onto) at the Lighthouse craft area. Putting the Doodle together is a good way to pass the time while waiting in line at a station.

**All adults** should be helping station leaders. We are all volunteers and we work best as a team!

Please pay attention to the set schedule. As a suggestion, station Leaders may offer your wagon(s) to play just for fun, so they can play too, if they are waiting. Keeping the station open after the set close time is **not allowed**.

**Please respect what the station Leader says. All stations will close at 3pm.** That is the only way we can start awards at 3:30 and be over near 4pm.

We will have 1 large Archery station and 2 BB stations. You will be given a set time, when you register, for what time and which range you will go to. If you miss your time, you may not get a second chance. The ranges will have a master copy of the times for the wagons.

Everyone, even station Leaders, deserve a break. Please understand if you need to wait while the station Leader steps away for a few minutes. Offer to help, if possible.

Special awards will be given out to any wagon that should be recognized. If you have something that is noteworthy about a wagon, in a good way of course, please let a station Leader know so they can turn it into the Nicholson Camping Center by 1pm. You may stop at the Nicholson Center yourself, to recognize a wagon.

Please do not leave the Saturday Show until you are dismissed. People leaving after their awards are finished are disruptive and disrespectful to the other Scouts.

For First Aid assistance, come to the Nicholson Center. Please drink plenty of water. Bottles may be refilled at any of the theme areas. The bathroom tap water is safe to drink (I've been drinking it for years and I'm still here).

Everyone should have a trash bag on their wagon. There is NO excuse for littering.  
Please Leave No Trace! If you see trash, pick it up.

### Helpful Hints for Packs



Parking is LIMITED; please **CARPOOL** if possible. The later you arrive, the further away you will need to park.

Check-in is from 7:00 – 8:00 am -- please be on time!

**NO Pets are allowed at Cub World.**

**FIRST** – Send an adult to the check-in window. Here you will be assigned a wagon number and issued the Scout gift bags, one for each paid Scout and paid Adult. The patches will be included in this packet. You will need to **know the ranks of the Scouts** on the wagon and how many **paid adults** on the wagon.

**NEXT** - Go to the wagon inspection station that will be near the check-in area. Look for a large sign. Your wagon will be inspected to make sure you have all the items on your Wagon Checklist. You will be given a unique inspection item.

Please insure that all of your wagons are fully equipped and road worthy. Any type of wagon is allowed.

Please be prepared for the weather (with proper attire)! **Open toed shoes are not to be worn by Scouts or adults.** There should be a maximum of 8 Scouts per Wagon. More than 8 Scouts will interfere with the shooting sports activities.

Archery and BB are so popular that we have increased this activity! Each wagon will be given a set time to be at the designated range for their turn. Remember, if you have more than 8 Scouts on your wagon, it will interfere with the shooting sports activities. The Range masters will have a copy of the master schedule.

Lunch Break is mandatory for all. Remember that you will be bringing your own lunch. Please stick to your schedule. Our station Leaders are also volunteers and they need a lunch break too!

All stations will close at 3:00 PM sharp. Please have all wagons gather at the Amphitheater for the show and awards. Please do not leave until the conclusion as this is very disruptive to others.

**Webelos Overnighter: “Construction Crew”** – be prepared (for a great time!). We'll work on the Webelos Required Adventure “Duty to God” and the Elective Adventure “Fix It”. Please leave gear in your vehicle. You may bring it down after the Chuckwagon.

Wagons can be brought to camp on Friday. On Saturday, park in the main lot, next to the Nicholson Camping Center building. If you are parked on the road, **all vehicles must be parked on the same side to allow clearance for emergency vehicles. (All vehicles will be parked on the same side that the Ranger's house is located on.)** No unauthorized vehicles are allowed to drive in camp.

**Station Leaders Meeting** = Wednesday, April 12th, 2017 @ 7:30 PM at Amica Roundtable Breakout. **Each unit attending needs at least one representative.**

**Theme dress is encouraged. Decorating your wagon is also a plus!**
