IMPORTANT: Only one vehicle will be allowed in the campsites at a time to unload troop / pack gear!

Check-in/check-out

Webelos and their leaders, parents and adult partners should check in with their sponsoring Boy Scout Troop on Saturday morning. Sponsoring troops can also help with meal planning and equipment. If you can't locate a troop to match up with, let us know and we might be able to help you find one. The intent here is for all Webelos to attend with a Troop.

Troops with their guests may arrive at Camp Norse beginning at 6:30PM on Friday evening. Please send a representative to the Administration Building to check-in when you arrive. Packs wishing to arrive on Friday night may check-in at the Administration Building beginning at 7:00pm. They must wait until their sponsoring troop has checked-in. A package containing the weekend's activities will be distributed after a roster and health history of ALL Scouts, Scouters, parents and camping guests is presented. One vehicle may proceed to the camping area for

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unloading, but the vehicle MUST be moved to a designated parking area afterwards.

Participation ribbons will be available upon checkout. Please have your site inspected before leaving. Deposits for buildings will be returned after the Campmaster has inspected the facility.

Troops running a station

Troops planning to run a station on Saturday should register with the event organizer, Greg Turgiss. Please keep the theme in mind when planning your troop's activity. We need stations on Native American Culture, how they lived. Check your Scout Handbook, Indian Lore Merit Badge Book, or the website;

Campfire

If your unit would like to present a skit at the Saturday night campfire, please let Greg Turgiss know about it by Saturday Morning. Last year's campfire was a great success. Let's do it again!

Friday Cracker-barrel

The SPL and Scoutmaster should attend the cracker barrel on Friday night held at the Dining Hall. Last minute announcements and schedules will be available at this time. The event is important to keep everyone up-to-date on weekend news.

Notes:

- A patch, Jamboree style campsite and unit flag participation ribbon are included in the \$8.00 per person fee which is due at check-in time.

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- Reservations can be made by a troop or pack online at the Narragansett Council web site. Units should pay when they check in at camp.
- Each Pack and Troop can bring something to contribute to the cracker barrel on Friday night.
- Class A uniform required for all Scouts for flag ceremonies.
- No camouflage clothing or clothing with offensive wording or images. Proper Scouting attire and behavior at all times.
- The Webelos Woods program includes overnight camping and there is no single day option.
- Webelos must be accompanied by an adult partner at a 2:1 ratio.
- Webelos camping rules apply; two deep leadership always.
- Packs, ask your Troop about helping with the food and preparation.
- All attendees must register and have medical form and permission slip.
- Cabins may be rented by units for an additional fee if they are not being used for staff or activities.
- No vehicles are allowed in camp except to tow the unit trailer to the site. The tow vehicle must be removed immediately after unpacking.
- The Trading Post will be open. Times will be announced at the Friday cracker-barrel.
- **Note that most sites are large enough to contain more than one unit and we will need to put more than one unit in each site to accommodate all attendees. So plan on sharing the sites.**
- Please plan on packing out all your trash. Dumpsters will not be available at the camp. Pack in, Pack out and leave no trace. Thanks.
