AMC HUT SYSTEM

There are eight Appalachian Mountain Club huts spaced one day's hike apart along the Appalachian Trail in the White Mountains of New Hampshire. They stretch from Lonesome Lake along the Franconia Ridge through the Presidential Range to Carter Notch, and range in surroundings from lowland deciduous woods to alpine tundra. The crews prepare hearty meals; bunks, blankets, and pillows are provided. Overnight lodging varies from hut to hut. Some lodges have large coed bunkrooms; others are divided into small rooms of four, six, and eight bunks.

After a long hike, enjoy a family-style meal with people who share your enthusiasm for the mountains. Browse through information about the areas natural history, or talk with the crews about your next day's hike. Resident naturalists and crews often conduct informal evening programs to introduce hikers to the mountain environment. Whatever your preference, enjoy the relaxed atmosphere and rustic accommodations of the AMC Hut System.

Carter Notch and Zealand Falls are open on a caretaker basis in the fall, winter, and spring. During the caretaker season the hut stove and cooking utensils are available for use, but you must bring your own sleeping bag and food.

It is necessary to make reservations early (at least one month in advance in the summer) with a deposit to insure space on the dates you request.

APPALACHIAN TRAIL

The Appalachian Trail meanders along the backbone of the eastern United States from Mount Katahdin in Maine to Springer Mountain in Georgia. Called by the Appalachian Trail Conference (ATC) the longest marked footpath in the world, the 2,100-mile Appalachian Trail (AT) passes through 14 states.

The skyline route follows the crest of the Appalachian Mountain Range, where steep terrain and major elevation changes are common. Because the trail ascends into high elevations the hiker can expect sudden weather changes. During all seasons, conditions on the high mountain ridges are far more severe than on the valley floors. When hikers travel above timberline they can expect the most severe and unpredictable weather. Rain or snow can fall at any time. Arctic weather conditions are possible during the summer months in the Presidential Range.

BIG INDIAN RESERVATION – ASHLAND, MA

<u>Directions:</u> Take Pleasant Street west of Ashland Square to Cordaville Road; Turn left onto Howe Street; Take left onto Cross Street; Camp is at end of dirt road on the left.

BARTON COVE CAMPGROUND – GILL, MA

Located just off Route 2 in Gill, MA on a peninsula on the Connecticut River.

There are seventeen individual family campsites and a group tenting area with fifteen tent sites.

Sanitary facilities consist of a very clean, concrete, tank-type toilet. Drinking water is available from a pump in the center of the group site. There are two large fire pits and three very large picnic tables.

A boat dock is nearby. Canoe rentals are: \$3.00/hour and \$18.00/day. Rowboat rentals are: \$2.00/hour and \$10.00/day.

Firewood is ample and supplied free-of-charge. However, some of it is oak and is 2-3 foot long and is up to 12 inches in diameter. You would do well to bring along a splitting maul.

An excellent self-guided nature trail runs through the peninsula. It takes about one hour to hike the trail. The trail includes some geological features, dinosaur tracks, what once were a dinosaur track quarry, as well as trees and other natural features.

Fishing is good both in the river and in Barton Cove. Swimming is permissible, but not recommended as there are no real "swimming areas."

The campground is owned and operated by Northeast Utilities, solely as an environmental and recreational facility.

This campground is an excellent "base camp" for canoeing the Deerfield River. Good stretches of the river are located a few miles west on Route 2. Kayak racecourses are permanently marked in the faster, wilder stretches of the river.

NORTHFIELD MOUNTAIN – NORTHFIELD, MA

The Power Station and Information Center is located off Route 63, approximately 6 miles east of Barton Cove Campground. It consists of a pump-storage, hydroelectric plant 2,500 feet inside the mountain, beneath a 5,875-million gallon reservoir at the top of the mountain.

On the mountain itself are 25 miles of well-marked trails, and in the winter trails for snowshoeing and cross-country skiing.

Tours of the upper reservoir and the cavern inside the mountain are available at no charge.

IT IS STRONGLY ADVISED TO BOOK TOURS A MINIMUM OF THREE MONTHS IN ADVANCE. This is to insure that you can reserve the campground and a tour of the mountain on the same weekend.

The tour itself consists of an excellent 20 minute movie depicting the planning and construction of the power station; a bus ride to the top of the mountain to view the reservoir; then down the 2,500 foot long, 26 foot diameter tunnel to the 328 foot long, 70 foot wide, and 120 foot high cavern inside which the generator/pumps are located. This does not include a tour of the actual power-generating machinery inside the cavern. Unfortunately, there are no tours permitted beyond the end of the tunnel.

At the Visitors/Information Center are numerous and interesting displays about the area. Hot and cold drinks and snacks are available here from machines.

Tickets for the 12-mile, 1½ hour interpretive riverboat ride can be picked up here. Cost is \$4.00 per adult, and \$2.00 per child under 14. Group rates are available.

This is an excellent activity in which to take part in, since all a Scout Leader has to do is to provide a means of getting his troop there!!!! The Northfield Mountain Staff will take over the planning and guiding tasks.

A simple phone call or letter to Northfield Mountain will result in a weekend of planned, guided activities for the troop.
