It involves two weekends of instruction and team-building at camp, followed by self-directed effort in your community, bringing your VISION to life.

How do I qualify to participate in Wood Badge?

- Be a currently registered Scouter.
- Prior to the start of the course, you must complete Leader Basic Training for your primary registered position.
- Request an invitation by completing and emailing the Invitation Request Form (below).

The course is limited to 48 participants and is filled on a first come, first served basis. Get your invitation request in today! The purpose of Wood Badge is simple. It gives men and women knowledge to strengthen the entire Scouting program from Cub Scouts to Venturing. It provides dedicated Scouters with the concepts, tools, and methods needed to be effective leaders. Wood Badge creates a structured opportunity to develop and apply critical leadership skills. The leadership skills will not only help you in Scouting but also in your career and your family life. Leadership is a skill that is used everywhere, on a daily basis.

Attending Wood Badge will make your Scouting job easier. Attendees gain an in-depth understanding of the skills of leadership. The skills you learn will help you become a more effective leader in Scouting, your career, your family, and your community life.

## WHAT CAN YOU EXPECT FROM A WOOD BADGE COURSE?

As a result of attending Wood Badge you will:

- Acquire a global view of Scouting as a family of interrelated, values-based programs providing age-appropriate activities for youth.
- Become familiar with contemporary team leadership concepts.
- Experience the stages of team development and practice leadership approaches appropriate for those stages.
- Have a great deal of fun in the company of interesting, like-minded individuals.
- Develop a renewed commitment to provide Scouting with the best possible leadership.

Wood Badge accomplishes these goals by building all the pieces of the course on a foundation of five central themes.

Those themes, and the presentations that directly support them, are as follows:

- Living the Values. Values, Mission, and Vision
- Bringing the Vision to Life. Listening to Learn; Communication; Leveraging Diversity Through Inclusiveness; Generations in Scouting; Coaching and Mentoring
- Models for Success. Stages of Team Development; The Leading EDGE™/ The Teaching EDGE™
- Tools of the Trade. Project Planning; Leading Change; Decision Making and Problem Solving; Managing Conflict; Self-Assessment
- Leading to Make a Difference. Servant Leadership; Leaving a Legacy

As the six day practical portion of the program draws to a close you will set some personal goals to practice your new knowledge and skills. In meeting your goals, you will strengthen both yourself and Scouting. You will have 18 months to reach these goals. By practicing your new knowledge and skills, you will become a more effective leader.
